y love of trains starts, like most model railroaders, at an early age. I was born and raised in Southern California alongside the Pacific Electric El Segundo Branch. Seeing those box electrics pulling a long string of tank cars up the grade from Standard Oil to Vermont Avenue in south central Los Angeles, with the help of a NWP. Southern Pacific Mogul on the head end, made a real impression on me as a young boy. The biggest impression was left by the Southern Pacific Coast Daylight. My family would often take a trip to visit my uncle in Santa Barbara. Many times we would be overtaken by that beautiful and wonderful red, orange, and black streamline train doing well over 80 mph just north of Ventura, California. Many called it the most beautiful train in the world, and if you ever saw it in person, there would be little to argue about. I still have a real love for the Southern Pacific and the Coast Line.

Santa Fe F3s. During my high school years, I found a local hobby shop just down the street from the original Athearn plant on Western Avenue. I saw a wonderful new HO scale SP trailertrain caboose in silver from Athearn and ever since it has been HO all the way. In the early 1980s, I built a module of the trestle at Gaviota just west of Santa Barbara, on the Southern Pacific Coast Line. Photos of the trestle were published twice in *Model Railroader*: January 1983 and February 1985. This same module was also published in the Southern Pacific Historical and Technical Society's Trainline on two different occasions. In the 1990s, I began building two

modules of Port Cost, a small engine terminal on the Southern Pacific mainline connecting the Bay Area to Sacramento. The modules have traveled from Portland, Oregon, to San Diego, California, over the years to different train shows and conventions. The modules were featured on the front cover of Railroad Model Craftsman in July and August of 2000. The modules have appeared in a number of other publications. I also wrote an article for Railroad Model Craftsman on the Southern Pacific's all-Pullman train, The Lark, between San Francisco and Los Angeles for the March 2004 issue. I am currently working with my club, "The Eel River Valley Model Railroaders," in Ferndale, Humboldt County, California. We are building a layout that is a historical representation of our local railroad the Northwestern Pacific here on the north coast of California. The Fortuna agent's home that I built for our Fortuna module, has been shown in Mainline Modeler's August 2004 issue and the SPH&TS Trainline winter 2008 issue. I hope to find the time soon to submit additional articles for publication on the

On a personal note, I have been married to my lovely wife, Carol, for 42 years. She has kindly put up with me and my hobby. We have three grown children, two in the Boise, Idaho, area and one in Portland, Oregon.
